Across the country, May is an important month of remembrance which culminates in the Memorial Day holiday and tribute ceremonies. American Legion Post 64 continued with its annual tradition of holding an Honor and Remembrance Service during our May member meeting. This year we rang the bell and called out the names of ten post and auxiliary members who passed away in the last year. This experience was especially impactful for me since I participated in an honor guard ceremony and penned tribute articles for three of the veterans: John Uhler, Ed Mangan and Dave Von Tersch. It was a simple, solemn and touching ceremony that gave our fellow legionnaires and auxiliary members the honor and respect they deserve. The ARC meeting room was tastefully set up with a remembrance table of photos, programs and red roses for the family and friends of the deceased. In front of the lectern was an honor table with a beautiful wrought iron cross, candles, a Bible, a Koran and a yarmulke. Red poppies stood out brilliantly against the white tablecloth and added the strong and significant symbol of loss, sacrifice and hope.

The slate of nominated Post Officers for the upcoming year was voted in and I am humbled and honored to be your Commander-Elect. As the first member of Generation X to hold this position at Post 64, I hope to help bridge the gap between generations and help engage and recruit more veterans from the numerous conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan after 1991.

May 17, 2023, Meeting Minutes - Roddy Charlton

Vice Commander Brenda Smull opened the meeting with greetings to 50 members and guests and called the special Honor and Remembrance meeting to order. The colors were pre-posted and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Vice Commander Brenda Smull. She discussed the total number of paid Post members is 132 members which is greater than last year's baseline of 111 members. Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt provided the Invocation. The minutes of the April meeting were published in the Post Newsletter and reading of the minutes was dispensed by the Vice Commander and accepted as published.

Adjutant Roddy Charlton discussed Post Reports. All four mandatory Annual Post Reports have been completed and submitted to the American Legion Department of Arizona. The reports included the Consolidated Post Report, Officers Report, Certification of Service Records of American Legion Officers, and Notification of Post Commanders and Adjutants. All eight American Legion Student Awards have been awarded. The Post supports Desert Vista High School, Mountain Pointe High School, Altadena Middle School and Centennial Middle School. This includes a Certificate, Bronze Medallion plus a \$200 Scholarship for each Senior Student. See Adjutant Report for additional information.

Adjutant Roddy Charlton conducted the Post Officers Elections. The Slate of Officers for 2023-2024 was presented at the May 17, 2023, Post meeting and published in the May Post Newsletter. The motion was seconded and approved. A vote by show of hands of present Post members was conducted and all were approved with no descending votes.
