September 20, 2023 Meeting Minutes—Roddy Charlton

Commander Brenda Smull opened the meeting with greetings to twenty three members and guests and recognition of **District 12 Commander Gerald Valle.** New **Post Information Officer David Green** was introduced and welcomed to the Post. The colors were pre-posted. **Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt** provided an Invocation. **Adjutant Roddy Charlton** conducted the POW/MIA Empty Chair Ceremony. Members and guests recited the Pledge of Allegiance. **Commander Brenda Smull** recited the American Legion Preamble to the Constitution. **Adjutant Roddy Charlton** structure a Roll Call of Officers with all present with the exception of the **Sgt-At-Arms Mark Shillinger**.

Officers Reports: Chaplin Rebecca Schmidt provided and update on post members. Finance Officer Jay Hendrix discussed creating a budget for all Post planned expenditures and start tracking budget to actual funds distributed. This is in accordance with Post 64 By-Laws Article 6 and Article 7. First Vice Commander Al Hunter provided an update to Post Membership. We are tracking at 37% renewal of Post members. He now has access and is working within the MyLegion.org website to manage Post membership tasks. Service Office Craig Annis has completed Post Service Officer (PSO) required training. He discussed his efforts with Information Officer David Green to support a veteran in need in Mariana, AZ by providing much needed food. He discussed the urgency to help local veterans who are in great need. He has started an out -reach program for the Post. Adjutant Roddy Charlton discussed the filing of the 2023 Annual Report with the Arizona Corporation Commission. We are current and in good standing and will protect all Post members from personal law suits when supporting Post activities. He discussed the Post IRS Including Letter to the National Headquarters/National Judge Advocate to include Post 64 in the national listing to the IRS for a blanket tax exemption and maintain our Section 501(c)(19) tax exempt status. He ended by reviewing the American Legion Student Awards Program and the Post participation and seeking one Post member to be the School Coordinator for Altadena Middle School, See Adjutant report for additional information. He discussed the need for additional Post member support of Color Guard and Honor Guard, with a summary of critical activities that are supported. A new transfer Post member Ron Raucci (Army Vietnam Era) discussed interest in becoming a Color Guard/Honor Guard member.

New Business: Commander Brenda Smull reviewed Post near term events with Veterans Social Mixer at the ARC on September 29th at 5:00 PM, Autumn Fest Fundraiser/Dance at the ARC on October 1st at 6:30 PM and the Unit 64 Auxiliary Charter Party at the ARC on October 18th at 4:00-6:00 PM with the Monthly Post Meeting.

Closing Prayer: A prayer was provided by Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt and meeting was adjourned.

Installation of Post Officers: District 12 Commander Gerald Valle conducted the Installation of Post Officers for 2023 -2024.

During the past several months we have been working on a realistic membership growth strategy that identifies where we are, how we got here and what we need to overcome our challenges. Action has already been initiated. First, we have clarified our mission, that of *Vets Helping Vets*, emphasizing the notion that as Veterans both Legion and non-Legion members, we are all part of a large family who have shared many experiences good and bad. Each year a larger number of Vets find themselves in dire situations both mentally and physically. Many find themselves homeless and helpless. *Vets helping Vets* should be our rally cry to build the passion that fuels our efforts. Next, we are completing the analysis on how we got here. Next is to successfully identify and enact the solutions to successfully revitalize our membership growth. As we travel this road towards success, we will be updating members as to our progress via presentations and our monthly newsletter.

Arizona Corporation Commission /2023 Annual Report

The 2023 Annual Report has been filed for Post 64 with the Arizona Corporation Commission. We are in good standing as a Domestic Nonprofit Corporation. Our Entity ID number is 16323020 and I sign as the Statuary Agent. The purpose of being incorporated is to protect individual members from being held responsible for the Post. Basic Example: we hold a function and someone is injured. They can only sue the Post for damages and not the member individually. Without incorporation individual members could be sued.

Post IRS Inclusion Letter

I have filed a new Post IRS Inclusion Letter to American Legion National Headquarters. This letter is sent to the National Judge Advocate for our Post to be included in National American Legion listing to the IRS for a blanket tax exemption. This will allow our Post to maintain our Section 501(c)(19) tax exempt status. This is to update our documents we have on file.

American Legion Student Awards

Our Post will continue this year with the American Legion Student Awards Program as we have done in the past number of years. We provide awards to two students selected by each school's nominating committees. One boy and one girl are selected from each school based on six qualities: Courage, Honor, Leadership, Patriotism, Scholarship and Service. The awards provided are a certificate, bronze medallion and for the high school students each receiving a \$200 cash award. We support four schools in our area and have a Post member School Coordinator assigned to each school (Mountain Point High School/Second Vice Commander Pete Meier; Desert Vista High School/ Adjutant Roddy Charlton; Centennial Middle School/Member John Augustyn and Altadena Middle school/need School Coordinator.)
