10/18/2023 Meeting Minutes — Roddy Charlton

Commander Brenda Smull opened the meeting to twenty six members and guests. Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt provided an invocation and included the one year anniversary of the new American Legion Auxiliary Unit 64. Sgt-At-Arms Mark Shillinger conducted the POW/MIA Empty Chair Ceremony. Commander Brenda Smull led members and guests in the Pledge of Allegiance. The American Legion Preamble to the Constitution was recited. We welcomed three new transfer members into Post 64: Larry Brown-Navy, Jay Roberson-Navy and Harry Coder-Air Force. Adjutant Roddy Charlton conducted a Roll Call of Officers and all were present. Commander Brenda Smull asked to dispense with the reading of the minutes, as posted in the newsletter. A request for corrections or changes was made, and none were made. A vote to accept as printed was made and second to approve the September Meeting Minutes as published.

Officer Reports: Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt discussed the Autumn Fest Silent Auction, raffle and 50/50 drawing and her appreciation of Post members to make this fundraiser a success. (see Finance Officer Jay Hendrix discussed a check of \$150 to Support The Chaplain Report.) Troops. He was out of town last week and did not get the final totals of last weekend Autumn Fest. He asked for any receipts for the event, that are reimbursable, be provided to him. The current Post balance is \$8,336. First Vice Commander Al Hunter provided an update to Post membership, current at 43% membership renewal. He discussed the disparity of the current on-line roster of 207 members and actual members of 137. A clean up of the on-line roster will be conducted to reflect our current Post membership. Second Vice Commander Pete Meier reported on the success of the Autumn Fest with ninety-nine guests attending. He discussed that all receipts of expenditures need to be submitted to Finance Officer Jay Hendrix and thanked Sqt-at-Arms Mark Shillinger for his leadership in pulling the event together. Adjutant Roddy Charlton welcomed the new members and will complete a Member Data Form and transfer them into our post. He discussed the current Post documents that provide guidance for the distribution and reimbursement of funds. These are all covered in the Post 64 By-Laws that were reviewed and signed of in 2019. Within the next year we will review all Post documents for updates and changes. (see Adjutant report for details)

Service Officer Craig Annis discussed the review of the on-line Post roster and will use this to complete a Buddy Check on all listed. Arizona department has information on Buddy Check, like a welfare check. For more information go to WWW.AZLEGION.ORG. His goal is to contact five to ten members by phone each day. His plan is to complete this critical outreach in the next six weeks. He is available day or night to provide support, (craigannis@ymail.com). Information Officer David Green discussed updates to Post website with Autumn Fest pictures. He also discussed the next Veterans Social to be held at the ARC on October 29th and that K95 masks and Inferred thermometers are still available.

New Business: Any requests for funds? None. Old Business:? None. For the Good of the Legion: First Vice Commander Al Hunter discussed that he and American Legion Auxiliary is like our Post with veterans outreach programs. He has asked this organization to make a presentation at our Post and look for possible teaming projects for both organizations. He also discussed the development of a Check List for new projects/programs, how to establish a committee and a leader to develop a plan and present the Executive Board for approval and funding. He will use this new check list/process to review the American Legion Auxiliary Celebration. Service Officer Craig Annis requested clarification of how the Post 64 and ALA Unit 64 interface. Al Hunter provided clarification that The American Legion and the Auxiliary are two standalone organizations that support each other.

First Vice Commander—Al Hunter

No organization can exist without members. Most organizations such as businesses and governments can attract members via salary and fringe benefits. Not so with volunteer organizations such as Lions, Rotary, Kiwanis, and American Legion aren't so fortunate. There was a time when social need was a magnet. Over the past decades that need has become lessened. The many studies focusing on the state of volunteer organizations show that about 1968, membership has been in a steady decline while the desire to volunteer has been on the increase. The key cause is the change in social dynamics. That requires a completely dedicated chapter to explain. Today the way to attract members is to provide a compelling cause that entices them to be willing to devote a portion of their free time to serve.

But membership numbers do not alone articulate today's challenges facing volunteer service organizations. For a service organization to succeed in its goals and objectives requires members to actively participate not only in its service activities but also in its leadership. Today, those numbers are also in decline requiring more of its obligations to rest of fewer of its members to carry more of the load. Burnout is unfortunately a growing occurrence resulting in a downward spiral of both leadership and activity support and the ultimate collapse of the organization.

Today, this scenario is become too common which includes the American Legion. Post 64 is not immune. Today we have approximately 170 active members. Of this number, 71% are aged 70 and above with 20% above the age of 80. Natural aging issues will negatively impact the ability to participate. That is just the fact of life.

Post 64, along with our new Auxiliary has sharpen our focus to increase our help for more of our veterans, thus the new slogan "Veterans Helping Veterans." This includes aiding our aging members. Performing this vital mission cannot be successful without the help of our members. Our membership mission is 2-fold, engagement of our existing membership and attracting new members. The need for our Vets and their families is growing. We have a vital mission to accomplish but we need your help to achieve it.

Post Finance / Reimbursement

There have been questions about the Post procedures for expenditures and reimbursement. In review of Post 64 Documents, the By-Laws provide the following guidance. Receipts are required for all reimbursements. If you have any questions, please contact me or Post Finance Officer.

- 1. Article 6 Section 1: " Post Commander shall approve all orders directing the distribution of funds."
- 2 . Article 6 Section 4: "The Finance Officer shall pay by check all expenses approved by the Executive Committee or Post Body."
- 3. Article 7 Section 5: "The Executive Committee shall have the authority to approve and pass the expenditures of all monies up to and including \$100."

American Legion - Basic Training

This is a 90-minute course broken down into six modules: History and Organization, Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism and Children and Youth.
