12/20/2023 Meeting Minutes — Roddy Charlton

Commander Brenda Smull opened the meeting to 19 members and guests. **Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt** provided an invocation. **Sgt-At-Arms Mark Shillinger** conducted the POW/MIA Empty Chair Ceremony. **Commander Brenda Smull** led the Pledge of Allegiance and recited the American Legion **Preamble** to the Constitution. Commander Brenda Smull asked to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the 11/15/2023 Post meeting as posted in the newsletter. A request for corrections or changes was made, and none were made. A vote to accept as printed was made and a second to approve the November Meeting Minutes as published.

Officer Reports: Second Vice Commander Al Hunter provided an update to Post membership. We have 137 Post members and have 65% membership renewal. The Post roster has been updated to reflect current membership with the help of Service Officer Craig Annis. He discussed the Challenge of Membership. Members fall into different participation categories: most members pay their dues and do not participate in Post activities and a smaller portion that are members who actively participate in Post activities. The success of our Post, and the challenge, is to have a larger active member engagement. Craig discussed a Post survey being sent out to members to provide feedback on areas for interest and improvement. He discussed the positive impact of the Buddy Check program in increasing participation. Service Officer Craig Annis discussed the status of the Buddy Check program. All Post members have been contacted. All but 17 were direct contact. A letter was sent to the few that were not directly contacted. He is asking for additional Post members to become Buddy Check Ambassadors and continue to make phone calls. A script has been developed and is available to use as a engagement guideline. Commander Brenda Smull announced that she has been contacted by American Legion National and an article will be published highlighting Post 64 Buddy Check Program. Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt discussed Post Sick Call. Post member James Wood is still in assisted living. Also, on our prayer list is Joe Hendrix, Jay's younger brother; Sean Brown, Lary's son and John's wife Barb Augustyn. **Finance Officer** Jay Hendrix discussed a check of \$250 was received from the ARC for Post support of the Arts and Craft fair. Thanks to the ARC for the funds. He also discussed that a Post budget for the 2023/2024 year has been developed and approved by the Executive Board and is now available to Post members on request.

Information Officer David Green discussed the updates to the Post website and engagement with Ahwatukee Foothills News with many articles published on Post activates by Post Commander Brenda Smull. **Sgt-At-Arms Mark Shillinger** discussed recent Honor Guard activities and the continuing need for new Post Color Guard / Honor Guard members.

New Business: Service Officer Craig Annis and Second Vice Pete Meier discussed the quarterly Street Cleanup Program. The cleanup will be conducted on the third Saturday of the third month. This will be a set day for the year. Volunteers will meet at 8:00 AM at the Safeway marked parking lot on 48th Street and Elliot Road. The required equipment of reflective vests, trash bags, pickers and doughnuts will be provided. Detail information and sign up will be sent out to all Post members with a cleanup day set for January 20th 2024. Past Post Commander Rod Green discussed that he is investigating Post support to a Little League Baseball Team. He also discussed his interest to continue support to the Post as a Member-At-Large. He will discuss these items with the Executive Board.

The current holiday season is a time of celebration but also a time of reflection, to count our blessings and acknowledge our achievements. The same is true for that of our organization. Now that we are closing out 2023, our focus is directed towards 2024 planning. The Post has committed to the cause of "Veterans helping Veterans." This does not mean that we will be replacing any of the commitments this Post has accepted in the past but adding another element to that list. The intent is to address the growing needs of veterans. Although there are many agencies and organizations that provide services for them, there are many veterans who fall through the cracks or struggle through the maize of the service providers. We must also not forget the families. Membership is key to address our mission of "Veterans Helping Veterans."

There are 2 categories of membership, active members (those who are currently up to date with their membership dues) and participating members (active members who participate in Post in Post activities). Currently our roster of active members stands at approximately 140. On the surface, subtracting those who have health and aging limitations. As of this past September, the Post had approximately 52 members over the age of 80. These numbers will continue to climb. The trouble is we have approximately 17 members who participate in Post's activities including leadership positions.

We need to approach this issue on 2 fronts. First, we need to get younger, attracting younger members. That is in the works. Unfortunately, that takes time, time which we can't afford. Second, we encourage our non-participating members to get involved. That provides a much shorter-term line.

Bottom line is we of Post 64 need to determine what kind of post we want to be. The number of homeless vets, those suffering physical and mental afflictions and those electing to omit suicide are growing. Obviously, the need is there to support those of our fellow Veterans. We need to step up.

Student Awards Program: We are starting our Post Annual American Legion Student Award program for 2024. We provide awards to two students selected by each schools nomination committees, one boy and one girl. based on six qualities: (Courage, Honor, Leadership, Patriotism, Scholarship and Service) We provide awards to four local schools: Desert Vista High School/Roddy Charlton Coordinator; Mountain Pointe High School, Pete Meier Coordinator, Centennial Middle School, John Augustyn Coordinator and Altadena Middle School, Roddy Charlton Acting Coordinator. We are looking for a Post member to take this position for Altadena Middle School. The Awards are a Certificate, Bronze Medallion and a \$200 Cash Award for each of the High Schools award recipient. The funding of the Cash Award is provided by matching funds from the Charlie Roloff's daughters and Post, \$200 for Mountain Point High School. An honor to serve: veterans helping veterans

In the United States, Nov. 11 is the national holiday when we recognize our fellow citizens who have served their

country in the military.

Veterans Day, unlike Memorial Day, is meant to appreciate the sacrifices of the millions of living veterans who raised their right hand and pledged to defend the U.S. Constitution against all enemies, foreign and domestic.

This year, Veterans Day has more meaning for me than usual.

With the active and brutal battlefields in the Middle East and Eastern Europe, I am acutely aware and distressed at the heavy price that is being paid by both military personnel and civilians during wars.

As a U.S. Army Veteran from the Gulf War, it my honor to serve as the Commander of Ahwatukee American Legion Post 64, which is focused on helping veterans and their families in our local community.

Now more than ever, we need to strengthen the social fabric of our society and in our neighborhoods and, in my opinion, this is best done by connecting and bonding with people in person with a sense of common purpose.

One of the things I miss most about my time in the military is the camaraderie and sense of shared values with fellow service members.

When in a foxhole together at the morning stand to during my deployment in Saudi Arabia and Iraq, it didn't matter what color your skin was or what your religious beliefs were. The only thing that mattered was that you were an American and believed in freedom, liberty, and our country's Constitution.

As part of our Post's Veterans Helping Veterans initiative, we are conducting Buddy Checks, where American Legion members are actively calling members to check in and see how they are doing. We are letting veterans know that we miss them and are thinking about their health and wellbeing.

This focus is in support of the American Legion's "Be the One" program, a suicide prevention effort which is addressing the growth health concern among those who served and are suffering with PTSD, TBI, or other debilitating issues.

American Legion Post 64 is Ahwatukee's sole Veterans Service Organization and we meet monthly (3. p.m. third Wednesday of the month) at the Ahwatukee Recreation Center (ARC).
