Sgt-at-Arms Mark Shillinger conducted the POW/MIA Empty Chair Ceremony. Commander Brenda Smull led the Pledge of Allegiance. Commander Brenda Smull asked to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the 12/20/2023 Post meeting as posted in the newsletter. A vote to accept the minutes as printed was made and a second to approve the December Meeting Minutes as published. Commander Brenda Smull made the opening announcements: The Celebration of Life for member Alice Maynard was held at the ARC on 01/07/2024 and was well done and well attended. Thanks to Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt and all who supported this activity. Bev Shillinger has volunteered to be the new Refreshment Chairperson, thank you. The Adopt-a-Street clean-up will be conducted on Saturday 01/07/2024 at 8:00 AM, meeting at the parking lot S/W corner of 48th Street and Elliot. A sign-up sheet is at the entrance table. A Post Officer Nominating Committee will be formed and meet in March for Post Officer positions. The Post Springfest will be held on 03/09/2024 at the ARC. Finance Officer Jay Hendrix will take the lead to coordinate this event.

Officer Reports: First Vice Commander Al Hunter discussed our current membership at 158 members. We have 130 members paid, so we are ahead of schedule. We need to continue to engage Post members to participate in activities and fundraisers. Service Officer Craig Annis has continued to support the Buddy Check Program. He has made direct phone contact with 15 new Post members. He reported on a donated medical bed from an American Legion member in Mesa. The bed and lift were picked up on 01/15/2024 by a team of Post members (Rod Green, Mark Shillinger, Roddy Charlton, Pete Meier, and Craig Annis) and delivered to the Paralyzed Veterans of American (PVA) in downtown Phoenix. Good work to all who supported this important task. Information Officer David Green presented a new flyer he created for the Post Veterans Social Mixer. The next Mixer is to be held on 01/31/2024 at 4:00pm at the Native Grill on Ray Road. The last Post Social Mixer was very well attended and brought in new and old Post members. Good news is that our active membership has reached 158 with renewals and new members paid dues at 131. One more renewal/new member places us achieving the goal set by the district. Since we have several new members and Post 100 transfers who are in process, we will easily exceed our Commander's goal of 136 by the end of this month.

We have had discussions between us and the Jewish War Veterans Copper State Post 619, located at Sun Lakes, regarding a partnership. For those who are do not have knowledge about this group, the Jewish War Veterans was established during the American Civil War. Post 619's sole mission is to support hospitalized, homeless and at-risk veterans in need in the Phoenix metro area regardless of religious affiliation. During our discussions we found both our organization missions are very much aligned. They are heavily involved in fund raising distributing Poppies at several shopping centers, especially Fry's food centers. They need our assistance manning these locations which they are offering to share donations collected with the amount dependent on the number of our members participating. They have offered to supply assistance from their members to aid in our activities. Per our agreement, 2 of their members have agreed to join our post (membership is in process) with Commander Brenda, myself and Auxiliary President Darlene joining their organization (we have completed the membership process). THE FOUR CHAPLAINS THE STORY AND THE CHAPEL

Early on the morning of February 3, 1943, the U.S.A.T. Dorchester was wallowing through icy seas off Greenland. Most of the 900 troops on board were asleep in their bunks. Suddenly a torpedo smashed into the Dorchester's flank. Frantically pounding up the ladders, the troops milled in confusion on the decks.

In those moments of panic, the coolest men aboard were four U.S. Army First Lieutenants Clark V. Poling (Reformed Church of America); Alexander D. Goods (Jewish); John P. Washington (Catholic); and George L. Fox (Methodist). The four chaplains led the men to boxes of life jackets, and passed them out to the soldiers with boat-drill precision. When the boxes were empty, the four chaplains quietly slipped off their own precious life preservers, put them on four young Gls and told them to jump.

The Dorchester went down 25 minutes later in a rumble of steam. Some 600 men were lost, but the heroic chaplains had helped save over 200. The last anyone saw of them, they were standing on the slanting deck, their arms linked in prayer to the one God they all served.

Far away in North Africa, Dr. Daniel A. Poling, distinguished American clergymen and father of Chaplain Clark Poling, was crouching in a fox hole when he learned of the heroic death of his son and his fellow Chaplains. In his mind was born the idea of a shrine in the memory of this noble sacrifice; a shrine where people of all faiths could worship God in a spirit of unity without the need of uniformity.

In the heart of a great city, Philadelphia, PA., the Chapel opens its doors to people of all races and religious faiths. It is a memorial to the Four Chaplains who went down on the U.S.A.T. Dorchester. It is an interfaith shrine; in it are three alters, one for each faith--Catholic, Jewish and Protestant. Above the entrance burns an eternal light which calls men to the unity these four Chaplains so heroically demonstrated. Chiseled deep into the stone is this dedication:

Chapel of Four Chaplains
An Interfaith Shrine
Here is Sanctuary for Brotherhood
Let it never be violated
