#### 03/13/2024 Meeting Minutes — Roddy Charlton

**Commander Brenda Smull** opened the meeting to 23 members and guests. **Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt** provided an Invocation. **Sgt-At Arms Mark Shillinger** conducted the POW/MIA Empty Chair Ceremony. **Commander Brenda Smull** led the Pledge of Allegiance and recited the American Legion Preamble to the Constriction. **Commander Brenda Smull** asked to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the 2/21/2024 Post meeting as posted in the newsletter. A motion was made to accept as printed and seconded, to approve the February Meeting Minutes as published. A special welcome was made to Jewish War Veterans Post 619 members who have joined Post 64.

Officer Reports: First Vice Commander Al Hunter provided updates to Post membership at 148. He attended the District 12 meeting and Post 64 received two awards for membership (for 100% membership for years 2020 and 2024). The Post also received an award for the highest retention of members at 90%. The Auxiliary Unit 64 received a second place membership award, missing first place by 1%. Congratulations to both organizations. He discussed the District 12 Poppy Fund of \$20,000 and requesting input for distribution. Service Officer Craig Annis discussed the 2nd round of Post Buddy Checks completion. He discussed changing the frequency of calls from every two months to once a guarter. He is requesting additional Post and Auxiliary members for support. He thanked the support team of Rebecca Schmidt and Don Gerhard. He recited "Be The North Star" as motivation to assist others. Chaplain Rebecca Schmidt discussed Sick Call. On our Prayer List are James Woods (in assisted living), Joe Hendrix (Jay's younger brother), Don Cieri, Bob Gill, and Ann Schminke. Finance Officer Jay Hendrix was not present. Commander Brenda Smull provided preliminary information of the SpringFest netting \$3,500, of which \$1,200 will be provided to the Auxiliary. Current Post balance is \$8,000 in checking and \$7,000 in savings. Post Officers will start the process of the distribution of funds.

**Adjutant Roddy Charlton** discussed the Post Officer 2023 - 2024 election process and open positions for Post Commander, First Vice Commander and Sgt-At -Arms (see Adjutant report). Any Post members interested in filling these critical leadership positions or have questions, please contact Roddy. He discussed the member transfer process and the utilization of the Member Data Form (MDF) that is completed/reviewed and signed by the Post Adjutant and then sent to National Headquarters. In the past three months some 15 MDFs have been completed and sent to American Legion National for processing. There are currently three that have some issues for transfer completion. He is working with National to resolve issues.

**Sgt-At-Arms Mark Shillinger** discussed the Color Guard support for the SpringFest. He discussed the Color Guard leading the 47th Annual Kiwanis Ahwatukee Easter Parade. Boy Scout Troupe #172 will follow the Color Guard carrying burial flags. **Finance Officer Jay Hendrix** will coordinate and lead the Boy Scouts as Detail Commander. The parade starts at 10 AM, Saturday 3/30/2024, at Warner Rd and 48th St. At the completion of the parade, the Post and Auxiliary will host hot dogs and sodas on the ARC patio.

Mark also discussed progress on a plan to bring Bingo to the ARC as a fundraiser for the Post and Unit. A meeting was held at Post 91 in Chandler with Tim Harvey this last week to review their Bingo games and lessons learned. They have three Bingo games a week and clear \$500 to \$700 per game. Post members Mark Shillinger, Al Hunter, Darlene Hunter (Auxiliary President), and Roddy Charlton were in attendance. Additional investigation is in works to determine the viability of our Post/Auxiliary on implementing Bingo into fundraising activities.

This year this appointed position will be changed in title to **Post Public Information Officer (PIO)** as responsibilities have expanded.

**New Business:** The process/selection of Post fund distributions will start in the next weeks (US Vets/PVA/and others). Post will vote on fund distributions. Local restaurant Over Easy has volunteered to provide licensed food servers for future events.

First Vice Commander—Al Hunter

Current active membership stands at 148 paid through the end of 2024. We have exceeded our goals by 10% and received an achievement award from the District. But, except for strictly social or-ganizations, the true strength and health of a community service group is in the number of members who actively participate in the organization's function, mainly its mission goals. Active participation includes service and fund-raising activities and leadership positions. No matter how aggressively the organization wants to serve its community, it is the number of participating members who determine its ability to meet its mission goals. An organization having 100 members but only 20 actually participate is at high risk of dissolving because they will eventually burn out. I personally know of one club, not American Legion, with 125 members that are facing extinction. This is a club that provides vital services to its community.

Post 64 was facing such a future. Fortunately, we were able to start turning this around with the addition of new and transfer members, the addition of a new Auxiliary unit and the addition of more social events to pull folks together. But we still have a way to go. It is important to remind ourselves of our mission, "Veterans Helping Veterans." Although there are organizations such as the VA, Wounded Warriors Project, DAV, US Vets Initiative, there are many that still fall through the cracks. Here is much to do but we need more member support.

#### Post Officer Elections 2024-2025

We are starting the Post Officer election process for 2024-2025. The Adjutant will conduct the election per Post 64 By-Laws and American Legion Officers Guide. #### Post By-Laws Article V (excerpts):

Section 1. Nominations for Post Officers shall be from the floor at the regular meeting in the month of April. Additional nominations may be made from the floor at the regular meeting in the month of May, and elections will be held at such meeting.

Section 2. All Officers shall be installed at the regular meeting in the month of June.

Section3. Any vacancy in an office shall be filled by the Executive Committee, subject to the approval of the Post, and persons so appointed shall serve until the next regular election.

Section 4. Prior to installation all prospective officers must verify eligibility for membership in the American Legion.
